## FRONT YARD LAMPS

All front yard lamps are required to be maintained in proper working order and lit during hours of darkness. These lamps provide security and serve as a deterrent to crime and vandalism.

Front yard lamps must also conform to the original gas lamp configuration. Architectural Control (ACC) must approve any new lamp or lamp part (excluding gas mantles and electric bulbs).

## Lamp Head

If the original lamp head is missing, AmericanGasLamp.com still manufactures Greenwich Hill's two approved, original styles. The square one is The Westmoreland #2300 and the round one is The Heritage #1700.

The lamp head must be black, cast aluminum, (11" W x 19" H), four sided with tempered clear glass panels **or** black, cast aluminum (11"W x 19"H) with a round globe. The round globe measures  $83/8"(top) \times 37/8"(bottom) \times 81/4"H$ . The cast aluminum parts of the lamp head shall be painted with fire-resistant black paint, except for the finial.

## Post and Placement

The post, on which the lamp head is mounted, is a black, round, metal post with an outside diameter of 3". The top of the lamp head should stand approximately seven (7) feet from the ground. The post shall be painted black and must be maintained in an upright position---not leaning. The front yard lamp must remain in its original location.

## **Conversion Kits**

Front yard gas lamps may be converted to electric. However, if the gas company no longer supplies gas to any front yard lamp, then conversion to electric is mandatory.

There are two types of approved electric conversion kits.

One is a 12-volt conversion kit with a 2-bulb inverted fixture. A source for this type of kit might be GaslightConversions.com. #1156 auto bulbs may be used with this type of kit.

The other option is a Dual GasGlow® LED, inverted socket assembly with 8" venturi, electric conversion kit by AmericanGasLamp.com. (This company still manufactures our approved, original type lamp heads.) This conversion kit may be ordered separately or already installed in an approved replacement lamp head. One never needs to change light bulbs with this kit.

These two types of conversion kits are the only approved conversion kits, as they more closely simulate the Greenwich Hill original gas lamps. Solar conversion kits are NOT approved. As a reminder, Architectural Control (ACC) must approve any new lamp or lamp part (excluding gas mantles and electric bulbs).
